Founded in 1990, the Valley Winds Concert Band serves the I-15/215 corridor in southwest Riverside County California. Our members reside mostly in Temecula, Murrieta, Lake Elsinore, Wildomar, Menifee, and surrounding communities. The organization supports two main ensembles: a 60-piece concert band and an 18-piece swing band. The groups perform concerts, entertain at community events, and support school music programs.

The Valley Winds Concert Band is a 60-piece ensemble made up of volunteer musicians from all walks of life. Members range from teenagers to 80-somethings, and include educators, engineers, writers, scientists, and a few professional musicians. The Concert Band performs a wide variety of music for different occasions, including marches, show tunes, patriotic and seasonal favorites, and modern band classics. Each season includes a few formal concerts, several holiday performances, and community events including the annual Memorial Day observance at the Lake Elsinore Cemetery.

The Valley Winds Concert Band is a program of Mt. San Jacinto College Community Education. The band rehearses during the regular school year on Tuesday evenings from 6:30 to 9:00 p.m. in the Band Room at Temecula Valley High School. The band is conducted by John Tribelhorn, Chair of the Music Department at the Mt. San Jacinto College Menifee Campus and Greg Cowee, Band Director at Margarita Middle School and Temecula Valley High School.

Burbank Community Band

The Burbank Community Band was founded in 1940 as the Lockheed Employees Recreation Center Band. Lockheed moved from the Burbank facility to Palmdale, CA, in February, 1993. The band decided to remain in Burbank. For a few years, it was known as the DOMAR Band for <u>Don</u> and <u>Mary</u> Holcomb, who directed and managed the band respectively. Rehearsals were held wherever space was found. Ultimately, Lockheed donated their recreation center and surrounding property to the City of Burbank, with the stipulation that the city would continue to support the band by providing rehearsal space. The City named the park after Robert E. Gross, the visionary Chief Executive and Chairman of Lockheed. The band continues to rehearse at its traditional time at Gross Park.

The name of the band, Burbank Community Band, was adopted on November 14, 1997. In December of 2011, Dr. Holcomb retired as the director and Paulette Westphal became the conductor. In 2012, a Board of Directors was formed, and the band incorporated as a 501(c)3 charitable organization.

Paulette Westphal passed away in 2022 and left the band to Assistant Director Julie Levine who ultimately recruited the Director of the Burbank Philharmonic Orchestra, Michael Stanley, to assume the position as Conductor. Julie remains to this day the Assistant Conductor and Manager of Band Operations.

The City Guard Band, under the direction of Linda Thompson , was organized in 1980 by a group of former musicians from high school, college and service bands wishing to continue playing the traditional band literature of Sousa, King, Fillmore and others.

The Band's style and repertoire are based on the original City Guard Band, founded in 1880 by J. M. "Jack" Dodge, a local entertainment promoter of the time. The Band was a part of the San Diego City Guard, a unit in the California National Guard.

The Band's library of over 2,500 compositions covers popular music from the 1880s to present-day, including many written specifically for the Band or for events in the San Diego region. The Band is part of the Heritage Band Society of San Diego, a 501 (c)3 non-profit organization, whose mission is to preserve band and orchestra music and literature from the 1880s to present. The combined library contains well over 5,000 compositions for band, orchestra, and ensembles.
